

**Project Synopsis** 

The Prince George's County Animal Services Division continued our spay and neuter campaign efforts by targeting low income/high poverty areas in the County to increase the number of animals that are altered and decrease our animal intake and rate of euthanasia. The project provided free surgery and rabies vaccinations to 262 pet cats and dogs.

# Additional Information

#### **Project Description**

The Prince George's County Animal Services Division provided free spay/neuter surgeries and rabies vaccinations for the pets of lowincome residents of Prince George's County through a partnership with Last Chance Animal Rescue who operates our in-house spay and neuter clinic, The Spay Spot. By providing these surgeries and educating the public on the benefits of spaying and neutering their pets, we are working to reduce the intake/euthanasia of dogs and cats entering our facility.

## Summary of Approach

We focused efforts in our targeted areas through Facebook, County website and CTV, public forums, and daily interactions with the public both at our facility (especially our animal intake desk) and through interactions out in the community with our animal control officers. Flyers were developed and distributed in the targeted low-income areas.

Accomplishments

Under the grant, the Prince George's County Animal Services Division provided free spay/neuter surgeries for 262 animals. Each animal also received a free rabies vaccination. The project increased the awareness in the community of the low-cost spay/neuter clinic services available in Prince George's County.

Lessons Learned

We will supply a monthly balance sheet for surgeries performed and surgeries still available to ensure that the number of surgeries by species and sex better aligns with those allotted under the grant.
