Project Synopsis:

With the funds from the Maryland Spay Neuter grant, HART For Animals Bredel Veterinary clinic was able to continue its Lifesaver no-cost program to our low-income residents in 2023. We were able to perform 308 no cost surgeries over the course of the year. This program goes hand in hand with our mission of saving the lives of homeless animals and we hope to continue this program for years to come.







Project Description:

The MD Spay Neuter Grant enables HART to offer it's Lifesaver No-Cost Spay/Neuter program to pets of low-income residents over the course of 2023. The program covers a target area of mostly Garrett and Allegany counties. The Bredel Clinic at the HART Center provided no-cost cat and dog spays and neuters. The surgeries included rabies vaccinations as needed, plus pre-surgery exams, and pre and post-surgical analgesics. All surgeries are performed with the same standard of care provided to all patients. An application and proof of financial eligibility were required prior to surgery.

Summary of Approach:

In the end of 2022, HART notified our local shelter and humane society about the return of the Lifesaver no-cost program in 2023. In addition, press releases are sent out and posters are distributed throughout the target area. As clients call our front desk receptionists to schedule spay/neuter surgeries, they were made aware of the assistance programs we offer to see what they would qualify for. Many repeat clients will specifically ask about the no-cost Lifesaver program. If they qualified, they were then added to the schedule and surgery would be performed at the scheduled date by either our head veterinarians, or our volunteer veterinarian who specifically comes to help with these programs. We report our results once a quarter. In July we updated our guidelines to be in line with the current years WIC Guidelines.

Toward the end of the year we run reports to calculate how many more surgeries are remaining to be scheduled. Final grant reports are filed once completed.

Accomplishments:

The Bredel Clinic at the HART Center provided 308 no-cost cat and dog spays and neuters to low- income residents over the course of 2023. This goes hand in hand with our mission of saving the lives of homeless animals in our community as it puts a huge slow in the number of kittens and puppies being born and brought into our local shelters.





Lessons Learned:

Thanks to the MD Spay Neuter grant, the HART for animals Bredel Veterinary clinic has provided the Lifesaver no-cost program to our low-income residents since 2014. We have completed over 3,200 surgeries since the beginning of the program. Each year we become more efficient and learn more. In 2022 we had not applied in time and therefore did not receive the grant. The greatest lesson we have learned is the extreme need for this program in our community and how grateful clients are that we have it to offer. All of this would not be possible without the MD Spay neuter grant, and we as well as our clients are forever grateful. We hope to continue the program for years to come.
