# **Project Description:**

This project offered free spay/neuter for the pets of families living at or under the ALICE financial scale.

#### **Summary of Approach:**

The guidelines were easy to follow and we didn't have any issues with the public not understanding the process. The program was well known in the community and we were able to fill all spots and complete surgeries. Spay/neuter has proven long-term health benefits for animals. Spaying females before their first heat cycle almost completely eliminates breast cancer and prevents uterine infections (including pyometra) and uterine cancer. Neutering males eliminates testicular cancer and enlargement of the prostate as well as highly reducing risk of perianal tumors. Spay/neuter is also cost-effective. It's much less expensive to spay or neuter than to pay for litters of cats or dogs that you may get. Helping people keep the pets they have also decreases the number of unwanted animals taken to the shelter, thereby lowering the number of animals that may have to be euthanized.

## Accomplishments:

This project helped families prevent unwanted litters of puppies and kittens from being bord as well as helping with the future health of their pets.
