Project Description

Queen Anne's County Animal Services (QACAS) was established in the spring of 2020. QACAS is the open admission animal shelter for Queen Anne's County. The average yearly intake for QACAS is 1,100 animals. This grant money was to help our county residents focus on preventative care for their animals.

Summary of Approach

Animal Services focused on marketing using our social media channels, discussing the program on a county-run TV show and posting informational graphics in the community. This approach along with word of mouth from the previous year's campaign helped fuel its success.

Accomplishments

These funds were exhausted rather quickly and helped many residents. While our focus on feline surgery fell slightly short of our goal, we have since been making up those numbers as we launched a county wide TNR program at Animal Services this spring.
